EardrumsPop is a label where we release free digital singles of our favourite artists. Every single will include two original songs and in addition a cover-song that deserves more attention. The cover art will be made by our favourite illustrators, and we like to see the single as a split-release between the band and the illustrator.

The singles will vary in style, from acoustic folk-songs to noisy indiepop, everything in between and more, but always warm and melodic.

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Introduction to the band: **Kids on Bikes**

is the electronic-surf-folk band from Neptune Beach, Florida that is sweet on riding bicycles. Sean Mahan writes each song as an introspective adoration to the many wondrous aspects of getting on a bike. For the past 10 years Kids On Bikes has been working on the forthcoming record set “77 songs of cycling”, an epic 4 LP veneration to schwinn stingrays, raleigh collapsibles, and powder blue beach cruisers.



The Cover Art Designer: Sean Mahan

» Can you give us a short presentation of yourself and your art?

I live in Neptune Beach, Florida where I have a studio space in the front of my house. I like to make figurative paintings with graphite and acrylic washes on wood to depict a sense of wonder about innate human sweetness.

» What are you working on right now?

I'm working on a series of paintings of children on wood. I'm particularly interested in how a quiet inward pause is reflected in facial expression and how that expression reflects the gentle and empathic aspects of human nature.

» Who / what are your greatest visual inspirations?

I love and have always been inspired by Kathe Kollwitz' printmaking. I think seeing her woodcut prints at a young age shaped my interest in art sharing a social narrative. Also, I am inspired by record art and really love doing it. I think it's a really cool relationship -- pairing art and music together.

» What are your future plans? Any exciting things you are looking forward to?



After that, I'll be busy making paintings for a solo show next March and making songs for the forthcoming Kids On Bikes record set "77 Songs Of Cycling". 

3) Tell us a secret.




4) What does life mean to you?




5) Define infinity.



6) How about a really colourful photograph?




7) Photograph someone who isn't expecting it.

The cover song: We have encouraged the single-bands to make a cover version of a song they think deserves more attention. Kids On Bikes have chosen to cover »A Girl Needs a Boy«, originally performed by Annette Funicello and rewritten by Kids On Bikes as “A Boy Needs A Bike”.



About Annette Funicello

Annette Funicello (born October 22, 1942) is an American singer and actress. She was Walt Disney’s most popular cast member of the original Mickey Mouse Club, and went on to appear in a series of beach party films.

Annette had a number of pop record hits in the late 1950s and early 1960s, mostly written by the Sherman Brothers. They were released by Disney’s Buena Vista label. Annette also recorded „It’s Really Love“ in 1959, a reworking of an earlier Paul Anka song called „Toot Sweet“; Anka reworked the song for a third time in 1962 as „Johnny’s Theme“ and it opened The Tonight Show Starring Johnny Carson on television for the next three decades. Funicello announced in 1992 that she suffers from multiple sclerosis, and she opened the Annette Funicello Fund for Neurological Disorders the year after.
